- I. Welcome, Opening Song and Prayer – 5”
 - a. Opening words
 - b. Prayer
 - c. Worship Song
- II. Bless, Thank, and Pray for our Educators – 10”
 - a. Bless and thank all our people who are in education. b. Bless and thank the workers, teachers, and administration of _____Elem/Middle/High School with leis, gifts and prayers.
 - c. Principal of _____School will share praises and prayer requests. d. Pray for the needs of _____School and Education in Hawaii. I Timothy 2:1-2 e. Dance and Prayer
- III. Our Father, Who Art in Heaven – 10”
 - a. Teaching: In prayer, we come to God as “Our Father”. Jesus called God His “Father” and taught us to address God in the same way as “Our Father”.
 - b. Testimony – “How God Has Become My Daddy Through Prayer”
 - c. Prayer
- IV. Hallowed Be Thy Name – 10”
 - a. Teaching: In prayer, it is vital that we come to God as our Father and that we honor and praise Him. John 4:21- 24 “Believe me, the time is coming when it will no longer matter whether you worship the Father here or in Jerusalem. *22* You Samaritans know so little about the one you worship, while we Jews know all about him, for salvation comes through the Jews. *23* But the time is coming and is already here when true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and in truth. The Father is looking for anyone who will worship him that way. *24* For God is Spirit, so those who worship him must worship in spirit and in truth.
 - b. Worship and Praise
- V. Thy Kingdom Come, Thy Will Be Done – 10”
 - a. Teaching – The Kingdom of God makes everything “pono” – it is “righteousness, peace, and the joy of the Holy Spirit” [Romans 14:17]
 - b. Video Testimony of what God did in one family as the Kingdom of God began to invade it through their weekly prayers around the dinner table.
 - c. Prayer for Families across Hawaii
- VI. Give Us This Day Our Daily Bread – 10”
 - a. Testimony of God’s faithfulness in finances as people prayed, gave and trusted God with their finances.
 - b. Prayer and Declaration for Hawaii’s Economy and Finances for individuals prior to receiving the tithes and offerings.
